

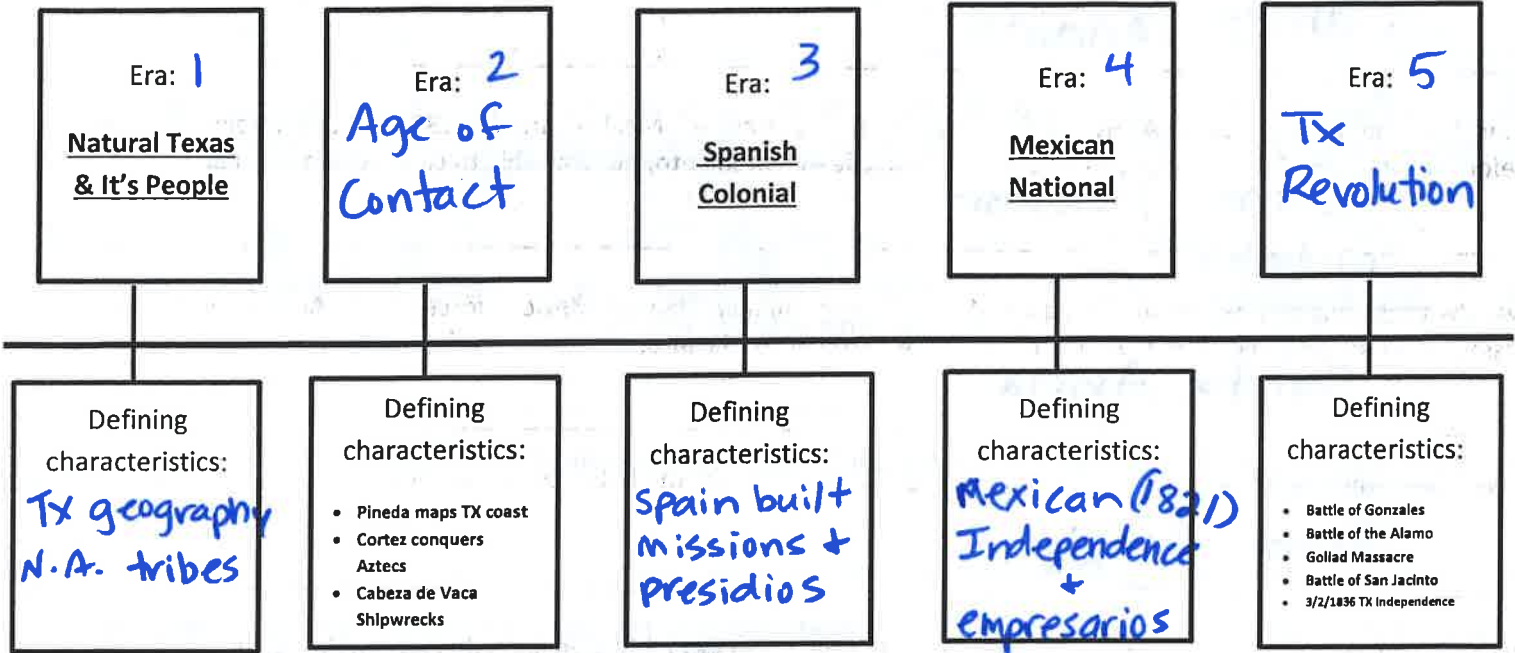

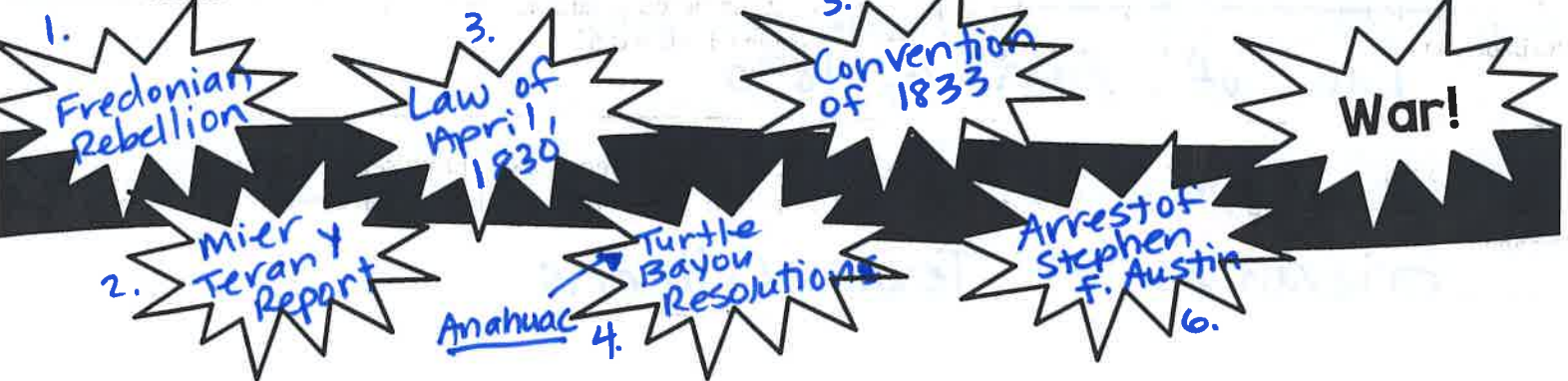

B. Written due to Mier y Teran's Report. Restricted the rights of settlers.

E. Wrote a letter complaining about Mexico and supporting TX independence.

D. Edwards brothers seized old stone fort because MX settlers were on the land they had been promised. They ran away when Mexico sent soldiers.

A. Mexican report stating Anglo influence was growing strong in Texas.

6. I was a delegate of the **Convention of 1836** and the main author of the Texas Declaration of Independence.

George Childress

7. I was the indecisive Texas leader who **surrendered** and was executed at Goliad.

James Fannin

8. I was the **Commander of Texas Army.** I order Texans to retreat from the Mexican army in 1836 so I could train my soldiers before the Battle of San Jacinto. I was injured in the Battle of San Jacinto, but was able to capture Santa Anna.

Sam Houston

9. I was the dictator **president of Mexico** and the leader of the Mexican Military. I led the Mexican forces at the **Alamo.** My forces massacred TX soldiers in Goliad. I was captured at the Battle of San Jacinto.

Santa Anna

10. I was a wealthy Tejano leader who led Tejano forces for Texas during the battle of San Jacinto.

Juan Seguin

11. I wrote a letter from the Alamo asking for supplies and **reinforcements.** My men and I died defending the **Alamo.** Their deaths encouraged Texans to keep fighting for Independence. "Victory or Death"

William B. Travis

12. I was written after Mier y Teran's report that Anglo settlers outnumbered Mexicans. I **prohibited immigration** from the U.S., forbade the introduction of new slaves to Texas and **restricted trade** with the U.S?

Law of April 6, 1830

13. Texan delegates listed me in their Declaration of Independence. They included: Mexico promised democracy, Mexico has kept the **government far away**, Mexico conducts all business in Spanish, and Texans' don't have trial by jury or religious freedom.

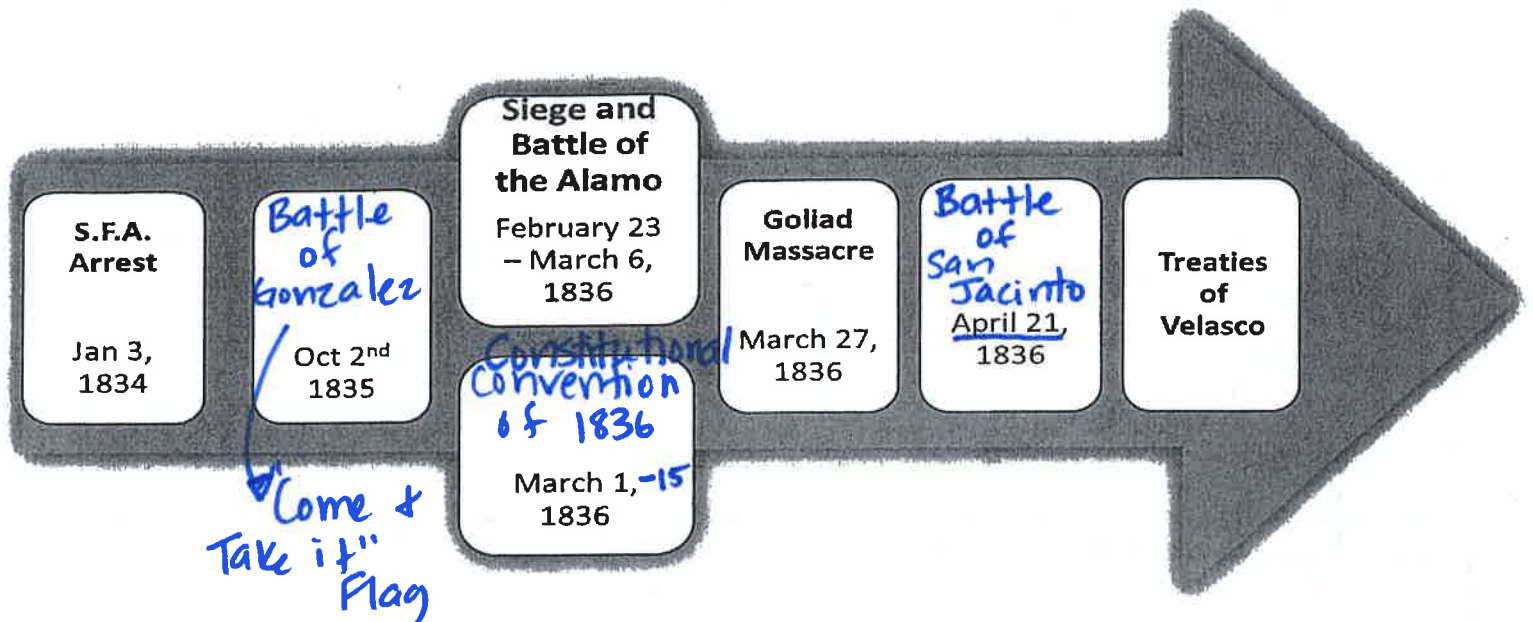

- A. Declaration of Independence and a new Constitution was drafted. Grievances
- B. Santa Anna ordered all captured Texans & Colonel Fannin executed.
- C. Almost all the Texans led by William B. Travis were killed in this battle. Santa Anna also lost many of his skilled soldiers. It became a famous rally cry of the war.
- D. First battle for Texas Independence. Fought over a canon. Texans waved a flag reading, "Come and Get It".
- E. Last battle of Texas Independence. TX independence won. Texans defeated the Mexican army after training. Battle cries motivated Texans in this 18 minute battle.
- F. Letter written from the Alamo. Author recognized need for more help in defending since the Texans were greatly outnumbered.
